# Mayers looking at cutting costs

A computer glitch and a late reimbursement put Medi-Cal Mayers Memorial Hospital deeper in the red than predicted for the month of November.

Administrators had hoped to report slightly improved financials before the holiday.

"The deficit was worse than last month," said CEO Jerry Fikes at the hospital's board meeting.

A \$1,000 increase in patient revenues was hardly worth mentioning with the hospital's net revenue down by nearly \$300,000 more than was budgeted and operating expenses at more than \$276,000 than budgeted.

The figures left the hospital with a \$292,000 deficit for the month.

In his initial planning for next year's budget, J. R. Mefford, the hospital's interim finance officer, told the board that he is looking at ways to cut controllable costs in every department.

He credited radiology, dietary, housekeeping, and the OR departments with keeping their costs down.

"They were all below budget and

are doing a fine job," Mefford said. The accounts payable department "is up to date and hanging in there" and turnaround in accounts receivables is at 67 days.

"It's a good number, but I'd like to see it lower."

In his budget assumptions for 2004, Mefford said Workers Comp rates are expected to go up 15 per-

Mefford also predicted a five percent increase in utilities and a three percent increase in lab supply

Trustee Jim Hamlin asked if the increases meant that hospital rates would go up, too.

Fikes said if costs go up he would expect a similar increase in charges.

In a related discussion, Fikes said that the Burney Annex was full and, as of Dec.17, Mayers had only two beds open in a shared room.

Even though there is a demand for the beds from Redding hospitals, Fikes said he wanted to leave the beds vacant for Mayers' existing patients who might need to be moved from acute care during the

Hamlin asked if they should consider opening the 12-bed wing, but Fikes said it would not "pencil out" financially.

With the hospital's "nursing crunch," Mayers would have to hire from the more costly nursing registry, he said.

In other business, the hospital's board of directors received information on the Sarbanes-Oxley Act of

The law was signed in the wake of Enron and similar corporate scandals and is designed to reform financial disclosure and corporate responsibility.

Under this law, chief executives and chief financial officers are responsible for the internal controls of their companies and they must certify that the financial statements are accurate.

It also holds officers criminally liable for untrue, missing or misleading financial reports.

"It holds boards personally liable for financial misdeeds if something happens on their watch," Fikes told the directors.

He said he wants to provide the hospital's board, as well as the boards serving the Mountain Vallevs and Pit River health centers, with information on the new regulations.

In other matters, the board

Engman said SARS and West Nile Virus are "expected to hit this year. We are planning our approach and being prepared in case it does hit."

## Highway 299 closed Tuesday after storm dumps snow

A winter storm Monday dumped nearly 15 inches of snow in parts of the Intermountain area and more at higher elevations, resulting in the closing of Highway 299 from Bella Vista to Burney Tuesday.

Three more inches fell late Monday night and early Tuesday morning, breaking trees and tree limbs along and over the highway.

The California Highway Patrol opened the road at 11:25 a.m. Tuesday only to Intermountain area residents traveling to and from Redding.

No big rigs, however, were allowed to travel on the roadway.

Delivery truck travel Monday had some drivers making the 54-mile trip from Redding to Burney in five and one-half hours.

The highway was briefly closed Monday afternoon near the drinking fountain west of Round Mountain after a tractor-trailer rig and cars lost control in the snow.

The 150-mile stretch of Interstate 5 from Mountain Gate to Medford, Ore., was closed most of Monday due to the heavy snows there.

A winter storm watch was issued by the National Weather Service for the Intermountain area beginning today and through New Years Day on Thursday.

More snow is predicted and winds gusting to 50 miles per hour are expected over exposed ridges.

# Share of tobacco funds presented to Bieber **Family Resource Center**

Lassen County has given Big Valley a share of its tobacco settlement funds for the new Big Valley Family Resource Center in Bieber.

Although the grand opening celebration isn't until Jan. 9, the Family Resource Center on Highway 299E is already buzzing with activity and ideas, said Director Lillian Arnold of McArthur.

Analuisa Orozco, of Adin, and an AmeriCorps volunteer, is the center's family home visitor and is available to assist both new and experienced parents and the elderly.

Orozco is also helping develop the curriculum for the Lassen 0 to 5 Program that provides support and resources to families from pregnancy until their child is age 5.

program includes The child development, parenting classes, play groups, and assistance with applying for Medi-Cal and Healthy Families insurance.

Best of all, the service offered are "free and open to visors approved the proposed all," Arnold said.

There is already a Play Group for toddlers and their families every Friday morning at 10 a.m. and video aerobic classes led by Office Manager Donna Worden at 2 p.m. weekdays except Wednesday.

"A small business group meets here, 4-H meets here,

and there are scrapbooking classes. There is a group who want to do a grant writing workshop and we're planning on that. We have a private office, which people can use to meet with agency representatives from Susanville. The sky's the limit. If someone has an idea, let us know," Arnold said.

The program is funded through Lassen County's share of the more than \$1 billion allocated annually to California by tobacco companies under the civil settlement reached in November 1998.

Laura Roberts of the Children and Families First Commission approached the Lassen County Board of Supervisors in August 2003 to request tobacco settlement funds for establishing a county-wide system of family resource centers.

She asked the supervisors to allocate \$300,000 each year through 2005 and \$400,000 per year from 2006 "through the life" of the tobacco settlement funding.

The Lassen County super-2003 budget for Big Valley Family Resource Center and allocated \$100,000.

Lassen County Children and Families First Commission has contracted with the Community Planning and Advisory Council, to operate the rural centers.

# Wilson, Cal add Insight to winning season

FRHS grad helps lead Bears to wild 52-49 victory over Virigina Tech in final collegiate game
